	<u>Chairman's Welcome and Public Forum</u> – the Chair opened the meeting and welcomed those present.	
HP14/2016	<u>Apologies for Absence</u> – none.

HP16/2016	<u>Accreditation</u> – there was nil to report.	
HP17/2016	<u>Lime Pits</u> – three quotations had been received from companies who are specialists in heritage conservation work. These are PWH based in Barnstable; pdpGreen Associates based in Truro and Attwell Associates based in Bodmin (Temple). Ms Ann Reynolds from Cornwall Historic Environments, who is a suitably qualified professional in this field, had been fully involved in this process. The Committee had chosen Attwell Associates who the Committee believe will deliver the project sympathetically, cost-effectively and to a high standard. Ms Reynolds advised that they have a track record of good community engagement. All the companies had been informed of the decision. An initial 'expression of interest' had been registered with Heritage Lottery Fund. We did not have the quotations in time to submit our initial interest by 1 st March which will delay the final decision. (We have subsequently been advised that we will get a response within 20 days). If we fit the HLF criteria they will assist with the actual application form. The application has to be made by 1 st June and a decision will be made in September. There are other local funds available and these will be looked into. No work on site can be undertaken until we have received at least a preliminary decision from HLF. If we do get a go-ahead we will discuss with HLF the possibility of removing the large tree stump on the wheel-pit rim that is de-stabilising the structure. The Tannery Residents are keen to clarify 'rules of access' and this issue will be discussed with Attwell Associates at an early stage.
