	Two letters of objection had been received and further comments had been made on CC's website.		
	<b>OBJECT</b> on the grounds the development of such a small plot was over-development and out-of-keeping with the surrounding buildings. The neighbouring properties would significantly lose privacy and the living room of Arnewood would be over-looked. The area currently acts as a natural drain and sump for the surrounding properties and if hard-surfaced could no longer fulfil this function. Currently, there is the possibility of this piece of land providing access to the field behind but this would be lost if it were to be built on, with the only alternative being via Fore Street and Penvro. PA16/08706, Plots 58 & 63 Former Tannery, Fore Street, Grampound - LBC for changes to internal layout of plots 58 and 63 on decision PA15/02474. ii. PA16/08951, Plots 58 & 63 Former Tannery, Fore Street, Grampound - non material amendment to internal layout of plots 58 and 63 on decision PA15/02473 (change of use and conversion of commercial units to 5 residential units). iii. PA16/08706, Plots 58 & 63 Former Tannery, Fore Street, Grampound - LBC for changes to internal layout of plots 58 and 63 on decision PA15/02474. Planning Applications Refused by CC – for information only. PA16/04956, Pennans Farm, Grampound - installation of a gas grid entry unit and associated plant, including underground pipework. Cllr. Egerton said it was refused because of the highway access off the busy A390. Pre-Application Planning Protocol – Members were invited to join the preapplication agreement scheme (details previously circulated via email). Clerk Referred to the Planning Committee for decision. 142/2016 Highways Matters a. Fore Street - Minute 125a/2016 refers. Highways had been asked to attend a site meeting with Members during the peak early morning rush hour to look at the issue of vehicles using the opposite carriageway when overtaking the buses parked at the bus stop in Fore Street. Mr Viv Bidgood had responded by saying: I regret there is little I can add to my email sent to Cllr. Jenkins ... The reality is that the traffic island is not the problem as there is plenty of room to enable drivers to undertake the legal manoeuvre prior to the keep left bollard – as such, there is no requirement to alter the current road layout. It is driver behaviour that is at fault and this can only be enforced by the Police. Members were urged to provide photographic evidence of such incidents All Members to the police. b. Bus Shelter Maintenance Audit - CC is carrying out a responsibility audit i.r.o. bus shelters. Their records show the PC to be responsible for three shelters. One is definitely the PCs (at the bottom of Old Hill). The other is the new one in Fore Street and was installed by CC. It was RESOLVED to accept responsibility for cleaning it, but not for maintaining it. Cllr. Freer offered to clean it. The third is in Hewaswater and belongs to St Mewan Clerk PC. The Clerk to respond accordingly. Bosillion Lane - Cllr. Turner reported a complaint had been received i.r.o. an overgrown hedge on Bosillion Lane. The landowner had offered to meet with the Tannery Management Committee to find a resolution. NFA. 143/2016 Environmental / Amenity Matters -The Tannery Field - Minute 128a/2016 refers. Cllr. Turner reported the trees and shrubs had been ordered. Cllr. Elvy had offered to plant them

when they are received. Fireworks – a complaint had been received that the field had been used for a firework display, contrary to the planning conditions. PA15/05226 refers. The relevant condition reads: "The site premises shall be used as public open space and for no other purpose, including any other purpose within Class D2 of the Schedule to the Town and Country Planning (Use Classes) Order 1987 (as amended), or in any provision equivalent to that Class in any statutory instrument revoking or re-enacting that Order with or without modification)." It was felt that permission from the PC should have been sought. It was Clerk **RESOLVED** to erect a sign advising that permission should be sought Clerk from the Clerk for any future events. The Clerk to respond to the complainant. Grit Bins - Minute 128c/2016 refers. Cllr. Elvy reported he will carry out Cllr. Elvy site visits to establish the best way to level the sites in preparation for new bins on Barteliver Hill and at Nantallon. Cllr. Taylor had provided the Clerk with additional laminated signs. NOTE - the Clerk to order two 0.28 m<sup>3</sup> bins, with salt at a cost of £164.87 Clerk each, once the above had been completed Tree Preservation Orders (TPO) - Minute 128d/2016 refers. c. Recreation Ground - Mrs Bunt, Chair of the VH Committee advised the Committee does not feel it is necessary to have a tree preservation order on the beech trees and pointed out that they had every intention of preserving them. No further action. ii. Creed Lane – CC had declined to create a TPO on the trees. iii.
