d. PA12/06977, Land South of Penans Farm, Grampound – erection of a single turbine with a maximum blade tip height of 70m, blade length 26m, hub height 44m, together with a substation, access track and associated hard standings.	
Cllr. Webb said the community was divided on the benefits or otherwise of wind turbines. He said that permission had recently been granted for two large and one smaller turbine in the same general area. In his opinion enough is enough. This application doesn't even come with any community benefit.	
Cllr. Fisher said he had attended the Renewable Energy Show, which was most interesting. However, he felt that it was a 'done deal' as far as wind turbine applications were concerned and that planning permission would be granted. He said we should work harder in informing those directly affected by these applications. He felt a better way would be for the NDP to identify the sites where turbines would be acceptable. The Parish could then go to 'tender' as it were to 'sell its assets', giving due regard to appropriate community benefits.

Cllr. Coode agreed with Cllr. Fisher and favoured a 'cocktail' of renewable energy (rather than so many wind turbines) and the decisions should be taken based on merits. He was in favour of a planned approach and very much against the emphasis given currently to wind as an energy source.

Cllr. Westbrook was wholeheartedly in favour of wind turbines and in her opinion it was of benefit to the hard hit farming community. She pointed out that turbines could be dismantled and the countryside would revert to its original state.

Cllr. Tyler said it was a misconception that wind turbines do not harm the countryside. In the case of the Garlenick turbines, for example, an ancient hedge and a sunken lane will be ruined. Her main objection to wind turbines is that they are allowed to be erected too close to homes.

Cllr. Fisher projected onto a screen a map showing the areas from where the Garlenick and Penans turbines would be visible. This covers a large part of the village.

It was **RESOLVED** to object to this application. It was further **RESOLVED** that Cllr. Fisher will compile and circulate a paper for submission to Cornwall Council.

e. PA12/07333, Land South of Penans Farm, Grampound – EIA Screening Request for the erection of a single turbine with a maximum blade tip height of 70m, blade length 26m, hub height 44m, together with a substation, access track and associated hard standings.

Cllr. Egerton had advised the Clerk that this is a technical issue decided by CC's Officers, who decide whether or not the planning application needs to provide a full EIA (Environmental Impact Assessment). Generally, it is only larger turbines that do. Even the Garlenick application for 2 x 2MW turbines did not have to provide an EIA. So it is likely that the Officer will decide that the Penans one similarly will not require it.

Agenda item 112h/2012 was taken at this point.

f. CC's Core Strategy – Dr Bernard Deacon had emailed (copy previously circulated) to ask Members to consider signing an open letter to CC, urging them to rethink their proposal to increase Cornwall's housing stock by 48,000 homes over the next 20 years. Members shared the concerns expressed and it was **RESOLVED** unanimously to support the initiative.

g. PA12/07212, Land Adj. No.1 Pepo Lane, Grampound – proposed dwelling. It was RESOLVED to object. It was further RESOLVED that the reasons would be that the visibility splay is poor from whichever direction it is approached and this is a danger to pedestrians and vehicles alike and furthermore this is an inappropriate, overdevelopment of infill property.

h. PA12/07277, Perran House Guesthouse, Fore Street, Grampound – change of use from C1 guesthouse to C3 residential. Cllr. Fisher left the room whilst this was discussed. Cllr. Baines said it was a pity that B&B accommodation was being lost in the village. However, it was felt that this particular application would lead to an improvement in the appearance of the property. NO OBJECTION.

i. PA12/06784, Garlenick Manor, Grampound – request for consent under section 37 of the 1989 Electricity Act for installation of an overhead line in connection with the proposed wind farm.

The Clerk had contacted the planning officer, Mr Ellis Crompton-Brown, to establish the precise location of the proposed line and whether it will all be overhead. Despite reminders she had not received a reply.

This was not the first time Mr Crompton-Brown had failed to respond to Members' enquiry. It was **RESOLVED** to send a registered letter to his immediate superior. Noted CC's deadline for making a decision on this application is 22nd August 2012.
