# Highway Matters -

- Average Speed Cameras, Fore Street Minute 118b/2019 refers. Prompted by Cllr. Taylor, Mr Adam O'Neill, CC advised the public consultation is scheduled to commence on 31st October 2019. It will consist of site notices, online consultation and a newspaper Notice which is required for the proposed revocation of the variable 20mph speed limit.
- School Road Safety Sign both signs had been 'torn and tatty' and had been removed.
- Grass Verges, Old Hill the Clerk confirmed these areas are not covered C. by the grant from Cornwall Council.

Mr Mark O'Brien. CC had advised the land is not listed on the Land Registry, but details of the mining rights may provide more information. Cllr. Taylor put the case for and against the PC maintaining these areas. Cllr. Turner suggested seeking volunteers. County Cllr. Egerton said he would like to see the Parish Council take on more tasks such as this. Further discussion deferred to the November meeting.

Mr Josh Parkin-Jones had cut back the Phormium on the corner of Pepo Lane. Members were pleased with the work Mr Parkin-Jones had done to the verges but dismayed that he had been verbally abused by a resident who wanted the Phormium removed.

Creed Lane – the defective road surface had been reported to Cormac who advised they had carried out repair work. Reference W1928768.

## Environmental / Amenity Matters -

Public Taps – Minute 119a2019 refers. Mrs Liz Fisher had carried out research at Kresen Kernow and her report had been circulated to Members. Historically, in 1914 the Parish Council were responsible for all the taps within the village, since then they had come within the remit of various organisations. It was RESOLVED to disconnect the tap and repair the wall. The Clerk to seek permission from the landowner and to task a builder / plumber to carry out the work.

- Public Rights of Way (PROWs) b.
  - Fal Footpath Minute 119b[i]/2019 refers. Cllrs. Bowden and Jones had met and agreed on the following signage.
    - Four x 300x200 aluminium composite sign with slots @ £8.95 each we feel four would suffice.
    - Twelve x 150x200 self-adhesive signs @ £1.95 each to be placed around the parish.
  - PROW Cutting Minute 119b[ii]/2019 refers. Members reported ii. Mr Hoskin had done a good job on the Fal Footpath. He had cut the following locations:
    - 405/11/1, entrance to the path off Pepo Lane. The waymarker sign had been broken by a fallen tree. The Clerk to try to secure a replacement.
    - 405/6/1, stile at the Nantellan end.
    - 405/12/1, Old Roman Road.
  - PROW 405/3/1 various issues were reported to the Countryside iii. Access Team: [1] the Tregidgeo footpath has a fallen tree across the path; [2] the original council footpath sign has reappeared but needs siting correctly with concrete; [3] at the end of the footpath near to Pensagillas farm the gate had been chained to the post preventing access.
- Public Telephone Box, Fore Street September Public Forum refers. BT Payphones advised they will now arrange for the kiosk to be inspected and if it is deemed necessary, they will instruct their contractors to repaint the box. The Clerk confirmed the 'phone kiosk is a listed structure. Minute 22/2008 refers. Cllr. Taylor will advise Mr Davies.
