The application is for reconfiguration of workshops to include the extension of one workshop and replacement of a timber store combined with a linking extension between the two existing workshop buildings and the provision of a small reception area.		
	Mr Mannell said the workshops had been built for use as a builders' workshop. He and his brother now run a joinery business from the site. Since the workshops had first been built, a new dwelling had been built nearby, and there is now a potential noise nuisance. Cllr. McGuinness felt there are two issues here one is a planning issue and one is the consequence of political management. The building has been sold. The new owner will not under any circumstances reopen a surgery in this location. If he doesn't get permission it will remain empty or it will be used appropriately in line with the use class it continues to enjoy i.e. light commercial and that may be the best outcome. There is a planning application in place for residential use currently in the form of the flats proposed. Therefore we are being asked to decide whether we want the use of the building to change from light commercial to residential. If we do, then we need decide whether the flats are appropriate or not and work from there. This is the planning issue. Replacement of GP services. The village requires a surgery but the Practice is unable or unwilling to provide that. I'm assuming it is an economically unviable option for the surgery. This is not a 	
	planning issue. It is evident that we prefer to have a surgery in the village. Therefore we will have to find new premises in the village and persuade the practice to man them. The lack of reliable, sustainable transport to anywhere let alone to the surgery in Probus is political! It was RESOLVED to object on the grounds that six flats, in that location, is excessive. It is overdevelopment and eight parking spaces for six flats is insufficient. b. Business and Planning Bill – draft Planning Guidance and new Permitted Development Rights. 		It was RESOLVED the Clerk writes to the KCCG and expresses its disquiet at the lack of alternative provision being put forward by the doctors following the closure of the existing building at the end of the year.	Clerk			
		Specific examples need to be put forward for where it is thought that provision needs to be made, e.g. those patients without independent means of transport, those with physical or mental impairments that would make it difficult to travel to Probus, the extra carbon footprint of so many patients driving to Probus etc.
