	Chairman's Welcome / Public Forum – the Chair opened the meeting and welcomed those present.	
	Mr Paul Fisher spoke regarding Minute 103b/2020. There is a problem with van drivers thinking the lane is suitable for deliveries. He had absolutely no problem with residents accessing their properties. Mr Fisher made it clear that he wanted to be a good neighbour. Cllr. Taylor said there had been problems with siting a footpath sign. Mr Fisher confirmed he was happy for the sign to go on his wall.	
	Mr Paul Mannell addressed Members regarding Minute 103d/2020. He had previously written to the Parish Council and this had been circulated to all Members. He explained there are difficulties in larger vehicles accessing Bonython Parc, Pepo Lane. Cllr. Bowden said excess vehicles are parking in Pepo Lane, including residents and builders' vans, etc.
