## **HELD ON THURSDAY, 20th MAY 2021**

## FOLLOWING THE ANNUAL PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

Members views were sought on the following matters.

	Present – Cllrs. Taylor (Chair), Freer, James, Jones, McGuinness, Turner (Vice Chair); Mrs Thompson (Clerk) and County Cllr. Bunney.				
	Chairman's Welcome / Public Forum – the Chair opened the meeting and welcomed those present.				
	Ms Fran Swanson and Ms Sarah Robson, Friends of the Fal were present regarding Minute 80a/2021 below. They reported the site meeting with Ms Penny Hodgson had come up with some ideas i.r.o. materials for the path. Taking the long view, a proper survey is needed. The materials that are currently on site need to be replaced with "803mm to dust", which would need to be compacted. Improvements needed to the drainage. The FotF would like to organise a site inspection with Trewithen Estate, Westcountry Rivers Trust, Miss Hodgson, Cormac and PC representatives. There is no funding currently available from any of these bodies, other than the Enhanced LMP fund.				
	Cllr. Jones asked if there would be any funding "in time" from any source. Ms Robson said FotF are seeking alternative funding sources. She said £13,750 may be available from the Enhanced LMP fund, but this would not be sufficient to do all that is needed. A tree survey had been undertaken by Trewithen.				
	County Cllr. Bunney had been contacted by the Head of Grampound School. He had been told by Trewithen that there had been no problems with the old SW Water holding tanks. He undertook to attend the site meeting mentioned above. Ms Robson said there will be a display / open meeting in the Village Hall on 30th June 2021 at 6-8pm.				
	In response to a question from Cllr. Taylor, Ms Robson said the FotF is an unincorporated association with a constitution.

"Not Suitable for HGV" Signage – Mr Bob Egerton had drawn Members' attention to the fact that CC had recently installed a massive "Not Suitable for HGV" sign at the top of Grampound Hill directing HGVs and coaches to go straight on to St Austell. Members proposed writing to CC to express disappointment that this sign had been put in but the PC's request for a similar sign to be placed on Bosillion Lane had not been actioned, or even acknowledged. In Members opinion the Bosillion Lane is worse than the lane to Treswallen. NOTE – this proposal was subsequently <b>RATIFIED</b> by the Clerk, Chair and Vice Chair under delegated authority.	Clerk

	a.	Weed Spraying – Cllr. Taylor reported there is some concern from local residents about the use of glypsophate to control weeds in the village. Cllr. McGuinness said he agreed with this view, in principle, but there did not seem to be a suitable alternative. Cllr. Taylor said the product is licensed until the end of 2022 and this is likely to be renewed. He, too, would prefer not to use glypsophate. At least one PC had opted not to weed spray but to strim them. This was deemed unsuitable for Grampound.	
		Members acknowledged the discontent but at the moment they are not aware of an alternative, effective product to glypsophate. It is known that Cllr. Jenkins is doing some research and if he can find a different methodology then Members will revisit the matter.	
		It was noted that no weed spraying is needed in the area around the market cross as weeds are removed by hand.	
		The Clerk to seek the views of Mr Parkin-Jones to establish if he knows of an effective alternative.	Clerk
