	a. PROWs No.1 (Fal River) –	
	The Planning Committee had dealt with: PA21/10475, Trewithen House Fal River A390 Grampound - works to trees namely:- 1704 Acer/Sycamore Dismantle, 1705 Common Ash cut back remove Sycamore, 1706, 1707, 1708 Common Ash reduce limbs, 1709, 1710, 1711, Common Ash cut back,, 1712 Common Ash reduce, 1713, 1714, Common Ash Dismantle, 1715 Common Ash reduce height - within a Conservation Area. Cllr. Taylor said the work appeared to be proportionate.

	b. Planning Application: PA20/10597, The Paddocks, A390 – Mr Robin Watson, Senior Development Officer (Highways) advised: As far as I am aware and can ascertain there are no measures in place to mitigate the perceived dangers of accessing the site. The application was determined by the Local Planning Authority (LPA) on the 30th June 2021 with conditional approval. I maintained a highways objection but the LPA, as is their prerogative, approved the application and their rationale for doing so is set out within the Officers report.

Noted James Hoskin, Police Neighbourhood Beat manager advised they had no plans for action, following the recent cycle incident on the Probus Bypass and suggested contacting Highways.

- a. Grit Bins Members to check stocks and signs as follows:

- v. Nantellan Cllr. Shaw found the bin is mucky inside but had instructions. Mr Parkin-Jones had cleared the vegetation.
- vi. Bosillion Lane no problems.
- b. Weed Spraying there was no further information regarding how to deal with the weed problem.

NOTE – Mr Alun Jones, Contractor had quoted £330 per spray using Acetic Acid (Vinegar). The cost using Glyphosate is £127 per spray.

c. PM2.5 monitoring – Cllr. Jenkins had contacted Messrs James Peck and Stephen Whitehurst, CC for advice regarding the best site for a monitor. He reported CC use a much more expensive 'reference monitoring equipment'.

CC had pointed out the challenges of measuring particulates and the highly variable nature of the recordings. There is a risk that looking at the data too closely will pick up shortcomings of the technique – wind, humidity, temperature, highly localised dust and conditions etc.

CC encourage local initiatives concerning air quality and suggested we also talk with PCs in Chacewater (for other air quality initiatives) and St Stephen-in-Brannel (for their experience of particulate monitoring).

Cllr. Jenkins

The CC officers advised caution with providing a new source of air quality data without considering in advance how it was going to be interpreted. They supported the suggestion that we consider a pilot looking at long term averages. At this stage no further action will be taken i.r.o. subscribing to a service to measure PM2.5 at a cost of £80 p.a.

  - i. Repainting work is progressing.
  - ii. <u>Clock</u> Mrs Cairns reported the fly problem in the town hall tower is becoming worse. The situation had been checked and it appeared this had now lessened. The Clerk to advise Ms Cairns and thank her for her commitment to this important Grampound landmark.
