	a. Fore Street – Members to receive an update i.r.o.:	
	 i. Cllr. Shaw had been advised that Rowan or Crab Apples would be suitable flowering trees to plant at both the West and East entrance to Fore Street, both being able to cope with the conditions. 	
	NOTE – Mr Viv Bidgood, Highways advised: I would say purely from a personal safety standpoint it would not be recommended to plant trees within the 60mph section of road. I also would have some reservation around signs being potentially obscured by the trees as they grow – we would generally not encourage anything to be planted in verges which are subject to routine trimming for safety for example. Perhaps planting something within the 30mph limit would be more appropriate and certainly far safer? If fruit trees is the preferred approach this would also allow residents to eventually (safely) benefit from any fruit requiring collection.

	 A suggestion from a resident to replace the dying Ash trees at the West of the village with London Plane trees to help reduce vehicle exhausts and noise pollution, and 	
	 A suggestion from Cllr. Jenkins to extend the single traffic lanes, to the East and West, by introducing road marking. 	
	ii. Cllr. Jenkins advised he is working on the bank to the East of the village and is encouraging wildflowers. He was thanked for this with Members praising the improvement.	
	iii. Speed Extents to the Western and Eastern ends of the A390 – Mr Viv Bidgood advised: "any changes to the existing extent of the 30mph limit is out of scope of the pending 20mph scheme, therefore we will not be considering extending the limit in either direction as part of the pending 20mph scheme."	
	b. Layby Activity – Mr Viv Bidgood, Highways did not favour removal of the trees and bank to open-up the layby. He had consulted with CC colleagues and his suggestion is that the PC submit a CNP scheme in the future for streetlights to be considered in the layby. Cllr. Jenkins subsequently referred to research that seems to show that lighting the area would actually worsen the problem. The Clerk to advise Mr Bidgood.	Clerk
