## Highway Matters -:

- a. Vehicular Damage to Town Hall Members received the following update:
  - Re-opening of both lanes to traffic on Fore Street. Cllr. Taylor reported the "bags of sand" had been removed. The pavement will remain closed but an area for a pedestrian crossing will be created. The Clerk to request an update as to when the road will be fully re-opened on Monday 20th February.

 The reply from Police in response to Members' questions regarding the type / number of recent accidents on Fore Street had been circulated via email. It is apparent that accidents are only recorded where there is injury or a crime.

Members were concerned that because the Police deem there was no crime the incident will not be formally recorded.

- Cllr. Taylor reported it seems clear that none of the extra work
   Members would like to see will be carried out at the same time as the re-instatement of the building. These included:
  - The replacement of the cement pointing with lime mortar.
  - Creation of a disabled access.
  - The large Pentewan stones will be replaced in their original places and not moved to the bottom of the wall.

Cllr. Taylor suggested that once the repair work had been done the PC may wish to look at having the work carried out itself.

b. *Proposed Flowering Trees, Fore Street* – Cllr. McGuinness reported the choice of species for Phase 1 will be limited due to available space and potential for conflict with traffic.

Cllrs. Taylor and McGuinness will revisit the site to:

- 1. Ascertain the likelihood of services in the chosen location.
- 2. Knock on doors and test opinion.

Forest for Cornwall may be a useful contact. The Clerk advised there is £1,493 CIL grant available towards the costs of the trees, including a plaque. For further consideration under the Coronation Event (Minute 26e/2023 refers). The Clerk to then seek permission of the owners of Chi Mena new build, including a tree in their car park

NOTE – a 'License to Plant in the Street' from Cormac/County Highways will be needed and a check made to ensure there are no services (drains/power) in the areas proposed for planting.

- c. EDG2116 SN05 Traffic Regulation Order Proposal Pepo Lane, Grampound. Members considered and SUPPORTED the recommendation from Highways to implement the proposal as advertised. The Clerk to advise Mr Wilson of the decision.

- d. *Grit Bins* Mr Tony Thomas, Conserv advised that as there is a new location for a bin he had sent the request to the Highways team to confirm compliance. Bins had been ordered to be placed:
  - <u>Trewinnow</u> just down from the farm, on way to A390.
  - The Tannery Site No.1 on the left-hand side, just as the path ends, as you enter the development.
  - The Tannery Site No.2 after consultation with The Tannery Residents Association (TRA) it had been agreed the second bin would be placed on the corner of the flowerbed entering the car park. Members felt that laying paving slabs direct into the bed would suffice as a base and Mr Turner will carry this out. The Clerk to ask the TRA to arrange for the shrubs to be cut back or dug out.
