		Representations by members of the of the public - that included the neighbouring residents of Oak Vale - described their concerns regarding the proposed Permission in Principal application. Notwithstanding the many detail issues that will arise with a full application particular note was made of the established 'turning head' which has been included within the proposed site boundary. The Parish Council were informed during the public session that the turning head was a planning condition of the original application (87/09/01411/00). The loss of the turning head is likely to create a number of highway and access issues.	
		It was resolved therefore, that on this anecdotal information the Parish Council OBJECT to the application until this issue of Condition be confirmed. The Parish Council have been unable to find the original permission online to cross reference the information and ask that the Planning Authority or applicant confirm one way or the other.	Clerk

	OBJECT: The proposed dwelling will be overbearing and intrusive resulting in a loss of privacy and shading. The proposal is out of character in the village and indeed the Conservation Area. The site is within the Conservation Area but as yet there has been no consultation report from the Historic Environment Department of Cornwall Council. The Heritage Statement states that the building will not be seen from Fore Street however this needs to be formally tested through a Visual Impact Assessment as it is felt that it will indeed be seen from various locations on the main street at the heart of the Conservation Area. Light pollution to South is likely to be extensive and detrimental to the properties facing Fore Street. Odour from the proposed swimming pool is likely to be a nuisance for neighbouring properties as too the noise from balconies which are above current and proposed ground level. The balcony at first level on the South elevation would be especially intrusive to all surrounding properties to the East, West and South. Ground clearance including sections of Cornish hedging and trees had	Clerk
	been removed in a likely breach of Conservation Area protection – this had been reported on a number of occasions to the planning officer. Further erosion of the now stripped banks continues – again the planning officer has been made aware.
